By the Numbers

Each year Second Chances supports hundreds of people as they take the first steps toward a more positive future.

In 2011 Second Chances

Provided **300** people with free clothing and gift cards.

Supplied each person served with more clothing than in any past years – several outfits in some cases. While we served fewer people total, the depth of need and our corresponding support was much greater than in the past.

Donated more than **2,000** pieces of clothing, shoes, accessories and gift cards to the clients of seven local programs and shelters.

Received **93,568** pounds of donated apparel. This represents a 34% increase from 2010!

Completed more than **35** corporate and community clothing drives.

Since 2005, Second Chances has clothed more than 2,000 people in need and reused and recycled 320,000 pounds of clothing, shoes and accessories.

Last year I had the pleasure of connecting with The Vineyard Church of Cambridge's education program and the students in the "Kids Church" Sunday School.

The 4th and 5th graders selected Second Chances as the beneficiary of their Easter community giving activities and asked me to come talk with them about our work and the impact of their volunteerism.

These 4th and 5th graders and their younger classmates were so impressive: interested, concerned, enthusiastic, and committed. They asked great questions, told stories about their own experiences, and listened intently. Their clothing drive was our most successful clothing

drive in seven years, collecting 1,946 pounds of clothing, filling an extra large cargo van all the way to the top plus one more half-full van!

These generous kids and the compassionate Vineyard Church congregation helped Second Chances to provide free clothing, shoes, accessories and gift cards to more than 300 people in need last year. I'm thrilled about this partnership and looking forward to learning from and working with these amazing kids, volunteers and teachers again this year.

Looking ahead: Big Plans!

The years ahead are going to be big ones for Second Chances and we need your help to be successful.

In 2011, Second Chances operated with a budget of less than \$40,000. We now have an opportunity to grow significantly. But in order to grow, we need to build our community of clothing and financial donors and increase awareness about our work. Fortunately, we have a plan.

We plan to purchase, decorate, and place seven new outdoor clothing donation bins in our communities. This expansion will more than double our donation locations, allowing Second Chances to collect more items from generous donors and to provide even more to people in need. To achieve this growth, we must raise \$12,500.

We also plan to make information about Second Chances more

visible and accessible so that we expand our community of supporters and increase awareness about our work. We will work with designers and writers to enhance our logo, website, and printed materials. We estimate these communications and outreach expenses at \$15,000.

While undertaking these plans, Second Chances will continue to operate as an efficient, small and local program. Each year we will work toward our goal of meeting all the need for free clothing, shoes, and accessories in Somerville and Cambridge. And someday, we hope to expand our work to cover even more of the Greater Boston area.
